PRINCIPAL'S POST

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We welcome all families and children back to Brighton Catholic Primary for Term 3. It was great to get around to all the classrooms this week and see the happy, smiling faces of the children who are excited to start another school term. We welcome three new families to the BCPS community, Nathaniel (4W) and Isaac Tiebout (3W), Neveah (1W) and Angel D'Arcy (PPB) and Chayce (5B) and Brooke (1B) Smith. We also welcome a new staff member, Mrs Liz Ward to 4W, I'm sure we will make all our new families and staff feel very welcome.

Staff Professional Development Days

The staff began this term with two professional development days focused around our school priorities for 2019.

Monday

On the Monday, the Transformation Team led the staff in our explicit instructional model, exploring the use of warm-ups to engage our children at the beginning of literacy and numeracy lessons and move previously learnt concepts from short-term to long-term memory. These will be implemented through all classrooms over the course of this semester.

Tuesday

Tuesday saw us investigate the importance of well being in education, through a presentation from Laura Allison, the Co-ordinator of Psychology Services in Catholic Education, WA (CEWA). The focus was on developing a whole school approach to the well being of our children, and subsequently also the well being of our staff and parents. Many learnings were taken from the day and will be a catalyst to continue building on our culture of well being at Brighton.

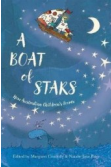
DRAMA & PERFORMING ARTS

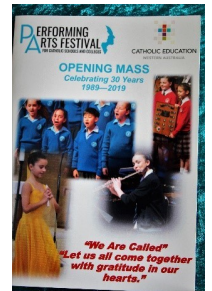
Next week Sydney Snesar in Year 6 will perform her Piano Solo '**On the Champs-Elysees**' and we wish Sydney every success.

This is an exciting time for all 150 children involved in Performing Arts and I am sure it will lead to many fond and lasting memories for children and parents, alike.

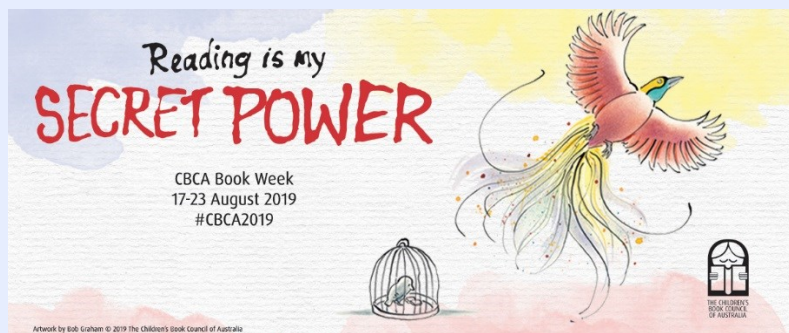

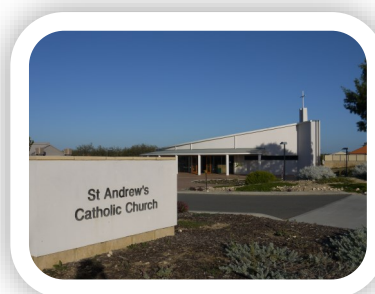

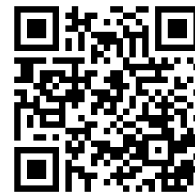

Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum

Dear Parents/Carer,

I am writing to inform you about the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) that your child/children will be learning throughout the second semester this year. The program is a Catholic Education WA mandated program, as part of our commitment to the Child Safe Framework. The teachers delivering the program have received explicit training in the use of the Curriculum. The KS:CPC is a Department for Education responsibility under the *Children's Protection Act 1993* and the *Child Protection in Schools, Early Childhood Education and Care Services policy* to ensure that effective abuse prevention programs are implemented and that all children and young people have access to the approved child protection curriculum. Although parent permission is not required under the *Education Act 1972*, we encourage parents/carers to seek further clarification if required and to provide the teacher with any relevant information about their child that could alleviate any concerns.

The KS:CPC is an evidence based, best practice curriculum developed collaboratively with child protection experts, teachers, educational leaders and other professionals.

The KS:CPC is divided into 5 documents specific to the age and year level of students. There are an additional three documents for educators working with:

- Aboriginal children and young people
- culturally and linguistically diverse children and young people
- children and young people with disability and additional needs.

The KS:CPC is predicated on two main themes which are presented through topics and activities of increasing complexity. The two KS:CPC Themes are:

- Theme 1: We all have the right to be safe
- Theme 2: We can help ourselves to be safe by talking to people we trust.

The two KS:CPC Themes are explored through four Focus Areas, which are examined in growing complexity in accordance with the age of the students. The four KS:CPC Focus Areas are:

- Focus Area 1: The right to be safe
- Focus Area 2: Relationships
- Focus Area 3: Recognising and reporting abuse
- Focus Area 4: Protective strategies

Each year level overview will have specific information regarding which Focus Area the children will be exploring in Term 3 and Term 4. 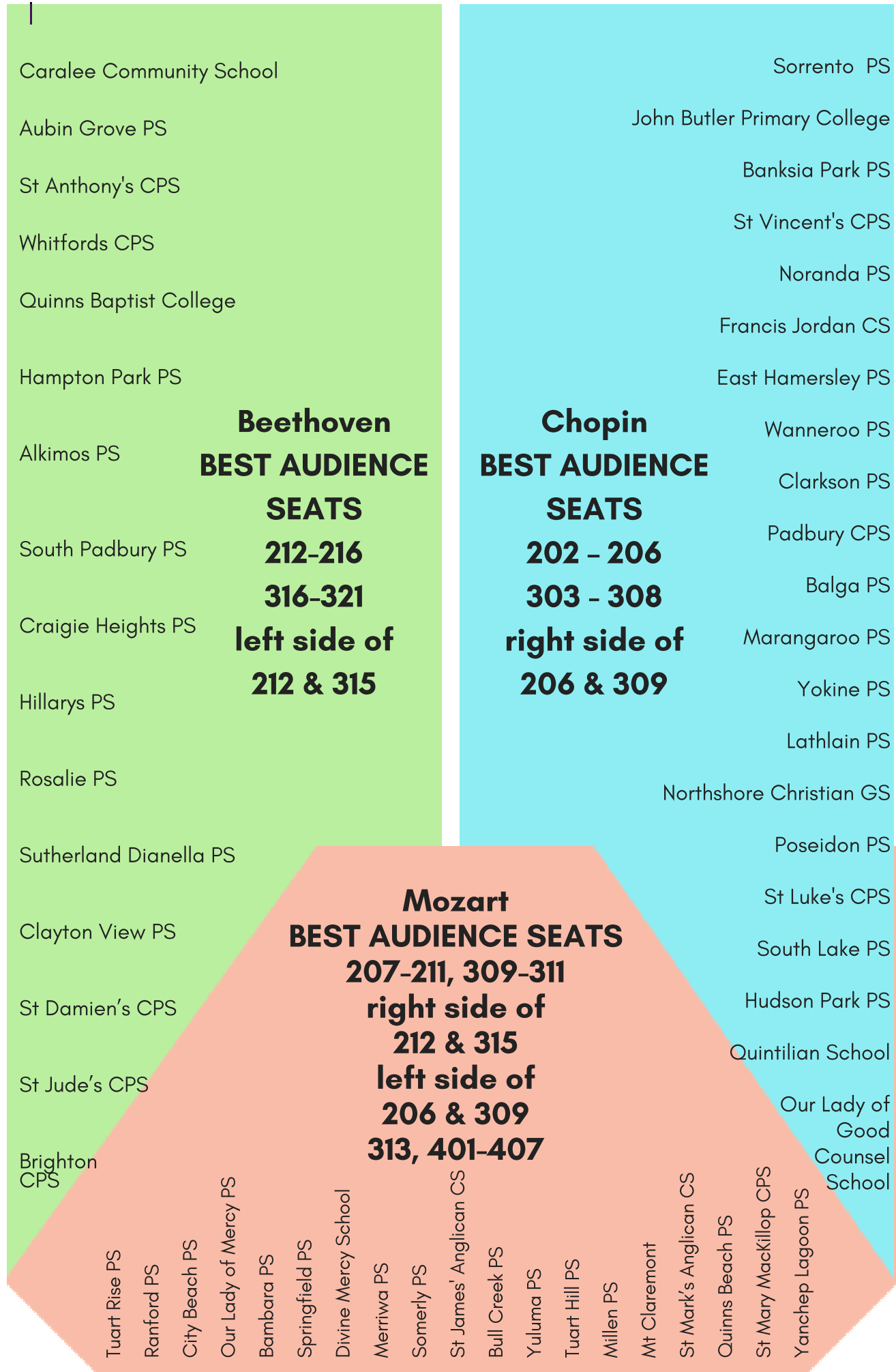
